# Principal's Message

Happy spring to our NMS and MOHC families! This is my favourite time of the year. The school is bustling with energy as students and staff make preparations for our annual Spring Showcase on April 25 from 4:00 - 8:00 p.m. On this night, the school, greenhouse, eco-classroom and CTEC are open to the public. Our students get a chance to show off everything they have learned throughout the year. They have so much pride in their work. The public audience provides our students with a chance to shine as they showcase their talents and skills. It truly is an event you have to see to believe. There is so much going on in one night.

The Foods 10/20 class is hard at work preparing treats and meals to sell in the concession. Come down to the Foods room at the end of the elementary hallway for supper. While you're there, make sure to check out the grade 5 & 6 Innovation and Design space in the school shop. Our upper elementary students are in a unique position where they have access to the shop space and tools to complete creative projects. They are excited to show everyone what they are working on.

Each of the elementary classrooms will be open for parents to come in and say hi to their child's teacher and take a look around the classrooms. Make sure to stop by the kindergarten classroom if you have any children turning 5 in 2024 for our kindergarten orientation. Myself and Mrs. Osinchuk will be available to answer questions.

Re-enrollment and enrollment of new students for September 2024 will be up and running for Showcase. Mrs. T will be in the school foyer ready to help parents with the registration process. She will also have yearbooks from the 2022/2023 school year for sale and have some clothing from our school's Entry shop available to see. Parents can order Barons clothing directly from the website and it is delivered to your home.

The greenhouse will be open with Horticulture students ready to answer questions and showcase their hard work. They are taking the Greenhouse Green Certificate Technician program through Lakeland College in Vermilion during their class time. They will be advertising their greenhouse sale May 10 and 11.

CTEC will be open for students to show off what they have been working on. Team Net Zero will be on hand near the 17.4 kW solar array next to CTEC to tell everyone how much work went into the energy audit they completed on the building and grant application processes to get CTEC to net zero. The hydroponics room will be open for the public to take a look around. Our junior high CTF and high school Horticulture students collaborate to ensure we have vegetables to provide to the community.

While in CTEC, check out the trade show in the cafeteria. NMS and MOHC students are going to be selling products they have made at home and in CTS/CTF. Come check out what they have for sale. Cash only.

Did you know that CTEC will soon be the home of the Myrnam Play Development Day Care? There will be people on hand across from the horticulture room to speak about the day care.

Ms. Neufeld, Mrs. Lefebvre, Mrs. Wagner, and other MOHC teachers will be on hand to demonstrate what online learning with MOHC looks like. They will be able to answer any questions parents may have about teacher directed and parent directed programs and how MOHC can provide choice in education for students.

The night will end in the school gym with a talent show and door prize draw followed by some closing remarks from myself. Plan on spending the better part of the evening with us. You won't want to miss a thing!

## Leap Day with the Grade 1/2 Class



### Leap Day Froggy Fun!

The grade 1/2 class enjoyed a special Leap Day celebration on February 29th. We learned about why we have leap day, and read a story about a frog who was born on leap day, and had to wait four years until he turned one! Then, we had some leap day measuring fun with some plastic hopper frogs. Each student got a little frog hopper toy, and had to make it hop five times, then measure and record the distance for each hop. We then had some leap day frog races, to see who can get their frog to hop over the finish line first. Mrs. C. treated us with some Derwent Pizza and cupcakes for lunch (as her birthday was on March 2), and we had fun with some Leap Day games, and a froggy dance party in music class! One student had so much fun, he asked if we could do this again next year! (Sorry, Buddy, you'll have to wait until you're in grade six!!!)

## Eclipse Fun with Grades 1/2

The grade one and two class enjoyed an "eclipse-theme" day on April 8. We began our day by making eclipse crowns to wear. We read stories about the eclipse, made an acrostic poem, did some math and language games and activities about the eclipse, and watched the eclipse live through NASA's livestream on the Smartboard at lunch time. In the afternoon, we created UV reactive bracelets with special beads that change colours in the sunlight, an eclipse model that shows how the moon blocks the sun, and we even made some "eclipse prints" using special paper that react to the UV light. The kids placed objects on the paper, which Mrs. G. then took outside and placed them in the sunlight for five minutes. We brought them back in, and soaked them with water to cure. How fun to now have a print that was made during our 2024 eclipse to keep! We had a lot of fun during our 2024 eclipse, and can't wait until the next one in 2044!

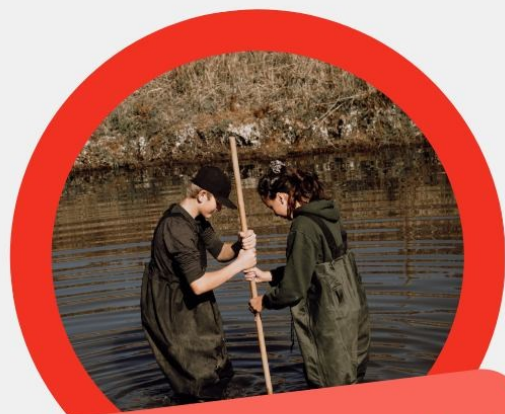

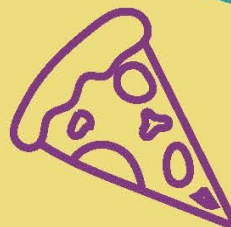

# SchoolMessenger Mass Notifications System

## Information for Parents

### What is SchoolMessenger?

SchoolMessenger is a mass notification system used to deliver information to families. These mass notifications are referred to as 'Broadcasts' due to SchoolMessenger's capability to simultaneously send messages to a vast number of destinations. Available broadcast destinations include phone, email, and SMS text.

Message recipients' contact data for parents comes from the PowerSchool Student Information System (SIS) database. This data is updated every evening so that any changes to phone numbers, emails and contact preferences will be current on every broadcast.

During phase one of implementation, the Division will begin using SchoolMessenger to communicate information to parents and guardians about safety alerts and school closures. Schools may also use this tool to share newsletters and information about special events and activities. Phase two, which includes activating the attendance reporting feature 'Safe Arrival', is expected to begin in early 2024.

### Phone Messages



- Phone calls will be reserved for emergencies such as safety alerts or early dismissal due to inclement weather.
- Phone calls will be sent as an automated message (computerized or human voice) and will come from the school phone number.
- In addition to a phone call, text and email messages will also be sent in emergency situations.

### Email Messages



- School newsletters and information about fundraising, hot lunch programs and other school activities will be shared via email.

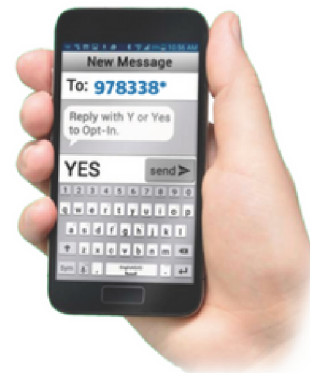
### Text Messages



- In addition to being used for emergencies, your school may also use text messages to communicate important information regarding sports and other after-school activities, field trip delays, etc.
- Under federal law originally designed to protect consumers from telemarketers, we have to get your permission to send messages to a mobile phone by SMS text. It is also just a good idea so that we're sure that message is going to the right phone number for the right person. Therefore, to receive texts you will need to opt-in.
- On **October 18, 2023** an opt-in invitation text to participate in this free service\* will be sent to mobile phone numbers of all primary contacts uploaded from our Student Information System (SIS). Recipients have to reply 'Y' or 'Yes' to the invitation text message to 'opt-in'.

### Additional Information

- Existing school-to-home communication tools currently used by classroom teachers (e.g. Seesaw, ClassDojo) may still be utilized.
- Schools will have flexibility in how they use SchoolMessenger. Stay tuned to your schools website and social media to learn more about how this new tool will be used at your child's school.
- All messages can also be viewed on the SchoolMessenger app. Parents are not required to download the app at this time, however, the Division will be asking all families to download the app when we move forward with the SchoolMessenger attendance reporting feature 'Safe Arrival'.
- Parents have the option to request that additional contacts, such as a child care provider, receive text and email messages from their child's school. Please call the school to make this request or if you have any questions about SchoolMessenger.



- If you did not receive the invitation text message or want to ensure you are registered, you can simply send a text message as follows:

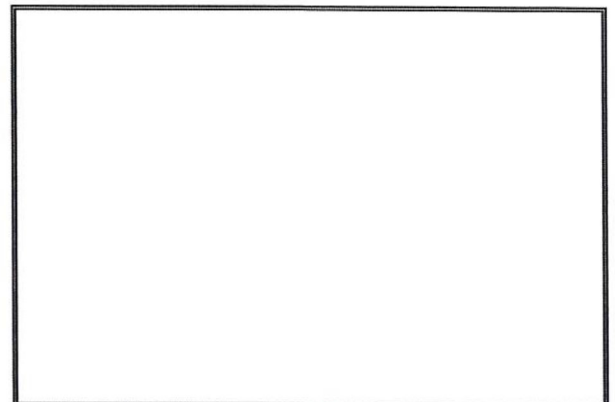

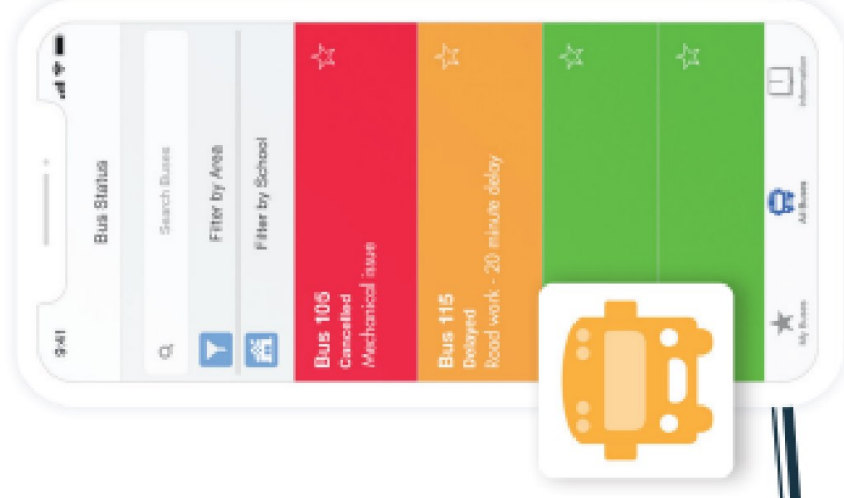
