Principal's Message



Happy October to all of our amazing NMS and MOHC families. Our students are taking advantage of the athletic opportunities offered at the school. These are chances for kids to move their bodies, learn new skills, build confidence, and have fun with their classmates. They learn to socialize in a different way than they do in the classroom. These teams include the junior high golf team earning a third place finish at SPAA, the junior high cross country running team with personal bests at races throughout the season, and our junior high boys and girls volleyball teams, with the girls earning first in the Marwayne tournament over the weekend.

The first goal in the NMS Education Plan is Fostering Healthy Learning Environments. The staff broke that goal into three parts: Purposeful Technology Education, Provide More Opportunities for Students to Build Relationships with Each Other, and Living Active Lifestyles. Providing extra curricular activities is a big part of this goal. But what about the students who are not able to participate in these after school teams? Starting October 8, Tuesday and Thursday lunch recesses will be intramural days. A grade 9 student is taking the lead on organizing the activity and schedule. Information will be coming out to students soon.

Elementary students from grade 3-6 are eating together in the foods room instead of in their separate classrooms. Tables have been arranged so students sit around them and see each other, encouraging eye contact and conversation. Though students in grade 7-12 are permitted to use their phones during breaks, they are being encouraged not to. There will be other things to do at breaks besides being physically active in the gym starting in October. These activities focus on other aspects of student wellness. They will include large colouring sheets to practice slowing down and mindfulness, being creative with Lego, puzzles, and interacting with classmates and staff through weekly game challenges.

The staff will continue to find ways to engage students in socializing with each other without the filter of a screen. According to the Canadian Paediatric Society, excessive screen time can impact sleep, academic performance, and physical activity. Establishing screen time limits can help children build healthier habits and ensure technology doesn't interfere with family time, learning, or physical health.

Ms. Urichuk has signed her classes up to participate in the Skills Exploration Day through Skills Canada. The purpose of Skills Exploration Days is to inspire junior high students to identify inherent skills and interests, connect students' skills and interests to trade and technology careers through interactive, hands-on experiences that promote creativity, empathy, and exploration, and promote trade and technology careers as a valuable and rewarding career choice. Students will be introduced to skilled trade and technology careers as they design, tinker and build. The tools for this have already arrived and Ms. Urichuk is excited to share them with the students.

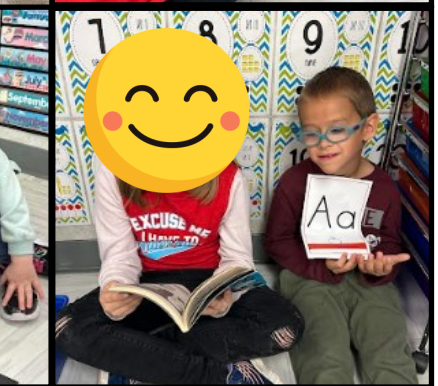
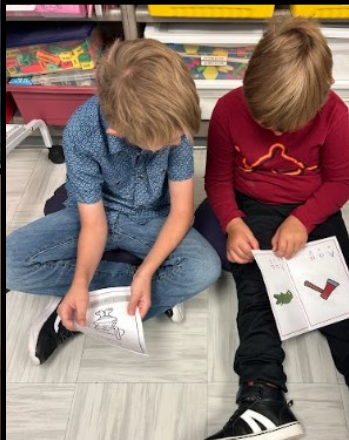

SchoolMessenger App (Free)

Using your mobile device, download and install the “SM Home” app (NOT ‘SchoolMessenger’ app) from the Apple or Google Play Stores: home.schoolmessenger.ca/. Sign in to create an account using your email address we have on file at your child’s school. Select attendance. Go to home.schoolmessenger.ca. Sign in or create an account using your email address that we have on file at your child’s school and report your absence. Contact your school if you need to update your email address.



By Phone

Call the toll-free number 1-844-502-5088 to report an absence using the automated phone system and follow the prompts.

If your student is marked absent and the absence hasn’t been explained in advance, our new SafeArrival system will be able to rapidly contact you by automated phone call, text message, email, or mobile app push notification to ensure your child’s safety.

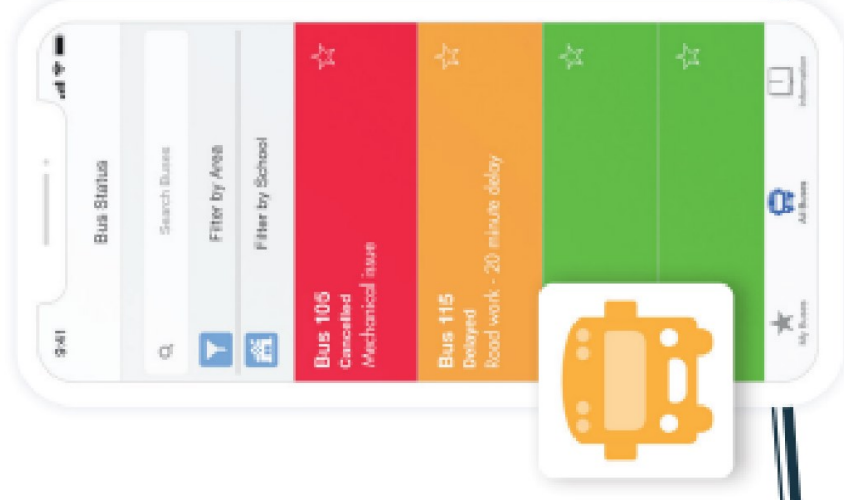
