PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

The NMS Education Plan Goal 2 is tied to student improvement in literacy. Goal 2 is titled Improving Literacy Capacity in Students and has been split into three separate goals:

- All students will be challenged to improve their reading level.
- Improving functional literacy.
- Increase literacy stamina.

It is not surprising that one of the goals in our Education Plan is tied to literacy. What has been surprising is the data the staff have already collected about our students. Along with using Star Reading tests students have already been doing yearly, Mrs. Godziuk has completed testing using a program new to our division called Acadience. She has completed this testing for all NMS students from kindergarten through to grade 6. Acadience provides an in-depth assessment of reading skills to help untangle the many possible reasons why a student may be struggling to make progress. The testing looked at several skills which, when successfully woven together, create a fluent reader. What the testing provided was realistic information on where our students are as readers. Staff are learning to analyze the data from this important testing and will be working to apply strategies to help each student improve the skills they need to work on.

How can you help your child improve their reading skills and fluency? This question changes depending on where your child is starting at and their age. Students from kindergarten to grade 3 should be read to for around 20 minutes daily. Make it a part of your regular routine to read when it fits in your schedule. Reading before bed time can be a great way to wind down off of screens and noise at the end of the day and settle into a calm mindset for sleep. Talk to your child about what they see in the pictures of the book and ask them questions about what they see.

For students from grades 4-6, keep reading for 20 minutes daily, but shift from older family members reading to the students themselves reading books at their level. The Myrnam Community Library is open Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:30 until 7:30 p.m. When your child is reading, if they skip a word, have them re-read the sentence without missing any words. Help them decode how to pronounce new words and show interest in the content of the books they want to read.

For grade 7-12 students, keep encouraging them to read for 20 minutes daily. This can be challenging as our kids get older. Students are more likely to read if they have people in their family who model being a reader. Ask your child what they are reading and read the books they are interested in. Discuss the books you have both read and ask your child what parts they loved or didn't like. Ask them which characters they connected with. Make it a dinner time conversation.

Verbal storytelling is a major component of the new English Language Arts and Literature (ELAL) curriculum in elementary school. Talk to your children about what you are doing when they are with you. When cooking supper with your child, talk to them about your family recipes. When working on the farm or yard work, talk to your child about the plan to get everything done and what steps will be taken to complete projects. Ask them to help make plans with you. This simple, real world work helps students to see the connection between a theoretical plan and what the first, second and third step to complete the project or recipe will be.

SafeArrival is an absence reporting system. Beginning, Tuesday, September 3, families can report an absence in three different ways that is most convenient for you using SafeArrival. Visit stpaueducation.ab.ca/parents/safe-arrival for complete information.



SchoolMessenger App (Free)

Using your mobile device, download and install the “SM Home” app (NOT ‘SchoolMessenger’ app) from the Apple or Google Play Stores: home.schoolmessenger.ca/. Sign in to create an account using your email address we have on file at your child’s school. Select attendance. For more information on the SchoolMessenger app, visit stpaueducation.ab.ca/parents/safe-arrival.

Online

Go to home.schoolmessenger.ca. Sign in or create an account using your email address that we have on file at your child’s school and report your absence. Contact your school if you need to update your email address.



By Phone

Call the toll-free number 1-844-502-5088 to report an absence using the automated phone system and follow the prompts.

If your student is marked absent and the absence hasn’t been explained in advance, our new SafeArrival system will be able to rapidly contact you by automated phone call, text message, email, or mobile app push notification to ensure your child’s safety.

HOW SICK IS TOO SICK FOR SCHOOL?



SEND TO SCHOOL

- A runny nose or just a little cough but no other symptoms.
- Sore throat but no other symptoms.
- No fever in the past 24 hours without fever-reducing medicine.
- No vomiting or diarrhea for 24 hours.



KEEP AT HOME

- Fever higher than 100.4 degrees F (38 degrees C).
- Sore throat, with other symptoms such as a persistent cough.
- Vomiting or diarrhea in the past 24 hours.
- Eyes are pink and crusty.
- Has been exposed to an illness where isolation is recommended.

SchoolMessenger Mass Notifications System

Information for Parents

What is SchoolMessenger?

SchoolMessenger is a mass notification system used to deliver information to families. These mass notifications are referred to as 'Broadcasts' due to SchoolMessenger's capability to simultaneously send messages to a vast number of destinations. Available broadcast destinations include phone, email, and SMS text.

Message recipients' contact data for parents comes from the PowerSchool Student Information System (SIS) database. This data is updated every evening so that any changes to phone numbers, emails and contact preferences will be current on every broadcast.

During phase one of implementation, the Division will begin using SchoolMessenger to communicate information to parents and guardians about safety alerts and school closures. Schools may also use this tool to share newsletters and information about special events and activities. Phase two, which includes activating the attendance reporting feature 'Safe Arrival', is expected to begin in early 2024.

Phone Messages



- Phone calls will be reserved for emergencies such as safety alerts or early dismissal due to inclement weather.
- Phone calls will be sent as an automated message (computerized or human voice) and will come from the school phone number.
- In addition to a phone call, text and email messages will also be sent in emergency situations.

Email Messages



- School newsletters and information about fundraising, hot lunch programs and other school activities will be shared via email.

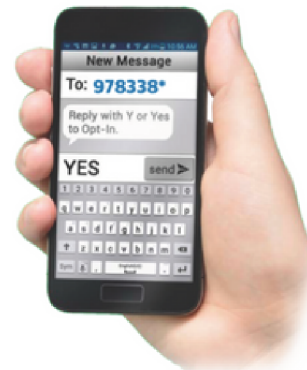
Additional Information

- Existing school-to-home communication tools currently used by classroom teachers (e.g. Seesaw, ClassDojo) may still be utilized.
- Schools will have flexibility in how they use SchoolMessenger. Stay tuned to your schools website and social media to learn more about how this new tool will be used at your child's school.
- All messages can also be viewed on the SchoolMessenger app. Parents are not required to download the app at this time, however, the Division will be asking all families to download the app when we move forward with the SchoolMessenger attendance reporting feature 'Safe Arrival'.
- Parents have the option to request that additional contacts, such as a child care provider, receive text and email messages from their child's school. Please call the school to make this request or if you have any questions about SchoolMessenger.

Text Messages



- In addition to being used for emergencies, your school may also use text messages to communicate important information regarding sports and other after-school activities, field trip delays, etc.
- Under federal law originally designed to protect consumers from telemarketers, we have to get your permission to send messages to a mobile phone by SMS text. It is also just a good idea so that we're sure that message is going to the right phone number for the right person. Therefore, to receive texts you will need to opt-in.
- On **October 18, 2023** an opt-in invitation text to participate in this free service* will be sent to mobile phone numbers of all primary contacts uploaded from our Student Information System (SIS). Recipients have to reply 'Y' or 'Yes' to the invitation text message to 'opt-in'.



- If you did not receive the invitation text message or want to ensure you are registered, you can simply send a text message as follows:

- You can also opt out of these messages any time by simply replying to one of our messages with '**Stop**'.



EXTREME WEATHER

Is my child's bus running? Coming home early?

Throughout the winter, weather and road conditions are constantly monitored with the safety of students and staff at the center of all of our decisions. We strive to inform parents of any delays or cancellations as quickly as possible. Here's how you may be notified:

- Bus driver contact
- Call/text from your school
- Local radio stations
- Bus Status app
- Division social media (Facebook and Instagram)
- Division website

How we decide:

When temperatures and/or wind chill is -40 or colder, buses are CANCELLED. Notice may be given the night before or in the morning.

-40°C

Buses may run in the afternoon during extreme cold weather under certain circumstances.

Weather checks start very early with The Weather Network and phone calls to designated staff living in each local area.

Even if buses are cancelled schools remain **OPEN**.

- If your child attends: meaningful learning still occurs
- If your child is absent: efforts will be made to ensure they do not fall behind



Decision is based on:

- Local road conditions
- RCMP travel advisories
- Weather and wind warnings
- Local municipality

Your bus driver also has complete discretion to cancel a route should they feel travel is unsafe.



If a decision is required around temperature and/or road conditions, the Director of Transportation consults with:

- Local bus drivers
- School principals
- Superintendent of Schools



Parents always have the final say about their child's safety and well-being and can always choose whether or not to have their child take the bus.



The Nations of Saddle Lake, Whitefish Lake and Frog Lake make independent decisions about their buses. Please contact them directly for any questions regarding their transportation policies.

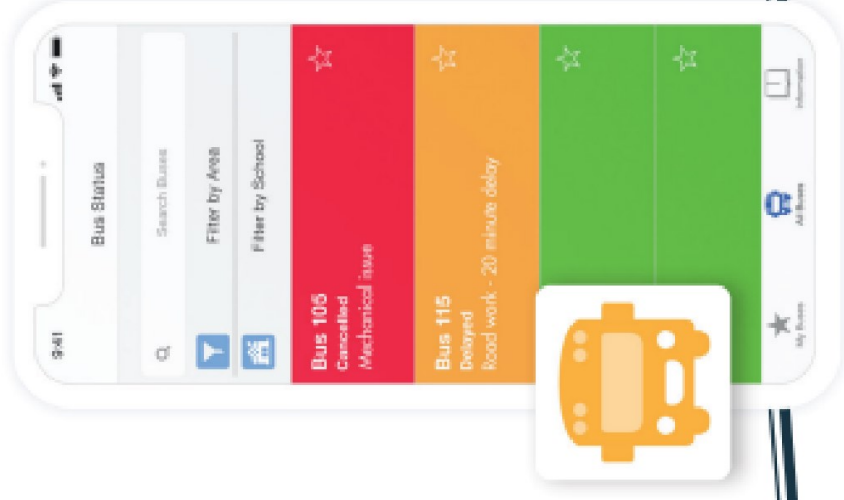
